Application Process:

Applications will comprise two parts:

- A written application (For eligibility assessment only)
 Deadline is Friday 30th April at 1pm.
- 2. A presentation to an audience at the TiR Showcasing event.

 Final date for submission of presentation is Wednesday 12th May 2020

Decisions will be made by the audience at the Techies in Residence showcase event via an online voting platform to determine the five organisations who will receive a Seed Fund Award.



Written Application

3 main questions

- Tell us how the Seed Fund will help with the further development of your platform or product developed during Techies in Residence project development (What are your proposed next steps and what specific actions will you take, who will take them, and over what time scale)
- 2. What outcomes do you hope to achieve as a result of these actions and what will be your indicators of success?
- 3. What do you anticipate doing after any period of seed funding has ended? How will you ensure the sustainability of the project?

Presentation guidelines: This presentation must directly relate to the project proposal outlined in the written application and be related to the platform or service developed during the TiR Programme 2020/21

Both the VCSE organisation and the Techie should be involved in the pitch. You can be as creative and innovative as you like in your presentation, do not buy in professional services for this presentation. This should be made by yourself, the VCSE and techies and can take the form of a recorded zoom call. The presentation should be no more than 4 minutes and should cover the following areas.

• 2 minutes: Your Journey so far

Introduce yourselves briefly. Describe why and how you developed your prototype - what was the challenge and who will ultimately benefit. Show your prototype on the screen, ideally via a short video walkthrough.

• 2 minutes: Your Journey from here

How a Seed Fund award will support the next stage of development for your project. What you would do with the money, the likely impact for beneficiaries & how you will make it sustainable and impactful in the longer term.

This should match what you have put in your written application proposal

Formatting Guidelines

- The full video presentation should be provided as one video file.
- It should be in mp4 format.
- You can record your presentation in zoom.
- Please ensure that the final presentation is ready to be presented to an audience and the sound is audible.
- Ensure that each person who speaks, states who they are and their role in the project.
- Ensure you have photographic and video consent from all involved in the video presentation, for publicity and promotional purposes by CFNI. This includes parental consent if video includes children.

Additional guidelines

- Please give us written details of who is in the video i.e name and role.
- Camera to be held landscape.
- Be aware of your background
- Check your sound quality (try and eliminate background noise). Recording outside will
 pick up wind so it's best to record indoors where possible.
- Please do not edit the video file, we will add names, organisations and subtitles to this to maintain consistency throughout the videos.

An **Audience Participation Digital Voting system** will take place to determine a rank order for those who shall receive an award. The following rules will apply:

- The showcase event will be open to the public. Individual organisations will be permitted a maximum of 10 representatives at the event.
- Every individual audience member, with the exception of CFNI and Innovate-NI staff that have been directly involved in programme delivery, will have 5 votes each.
- These votes must all be used and with only 1 vote per project. If the total number of votes cast does not match the number of participants, the vote will be re-run.

The criteria to be used by the audience for decision-making at the showcase event are as follows:

- 1. Which projects have most potential to benefit individuals and communities
- 2. Which projects have demonstrated the most creativity and innovation in developing their prototype
- 3. Which projects have the clearest idea for what they will use the Seed Fund grant for
- 4. Which projects seem most likely to be sustainable
